Berry's laughs packaged with word against drugs

Speaker says being individual is acceptable

Dr. Bertice Berry delivered her "message with comedy and comedy with a message" to an audience of about 60 people Friday at the Kimball Recital Hall. The lecture was a benefit for the Lincoln/Lancaster Drug Project.

Berry covered various subject matters in her 1 1/2 hour lecture, including drug abuse, which she called an "attempt to solve other problems."

She also explained that it was acceptable to be an individual in today's society.

"It's OK to be different," she said.

Berry used an impressive array of anecdotes to exercise her points and her ideas about creativity and society. She even handed out grades.

She gave the general public a grade of C and the American government a C- for "average" creativity.

Berry said many people use and abuse drugs, then blame the media for their problems. Those people, she said, think the media advocates the abuse because they show stars doing it.

Berry said she was very serious about enjoying life and informing others. She said she wanted to help others tap into their own creativity and spirit.

Berry also said she was excited about hosting a syndicated talk show next fall.
