 "ule games with Division II opponents," he said. "Teams out West and in the South have a very easy scheduling situation. Cal. State-Fullerton, for example, can just reschedule with a school 20 minutes away."

The Huskers finished the season with a 35-23 overall record and a third-place finish at the Big Eight tournament.

At the Big Eight tournament, Nebraska started off with a victory over Missouri. Sophomore Troy Brohawn tossed a complete game five-hitter in the Huskers' 7-3 win.

Then came Kansas in their second game. Errors cost the Huskers as the Jayhawks rallied for a 5-4 victory.

"That game could have gone either way," Sagmoen said.

The Huskers bounced back with a 19-14 win in a slugfest against Oklahoma. Nebraska was then knocked out of the tournament by Oklahoma State 8-4.

Freshman Alvie Shepherd pitched back-to-back games against the Sooners and the Cowboys.

"We played awfully well in the tournament," Sanders said. "We just came up a little short on pitchers."

Both Sagmoen and Brohawn were named first-team All-Americans by Collegiate Baseball. Sagmoen was also named Big Eight Player of the Year and MVP of the Big Eight tournament.

Brohawn, in his first year pitching at Nebraska, was 13-0 on the season, breaking four school pitching records.

He broke the school records for most wins with 13, most innings pitched with 111, most strikeouts with 123 and most complete games with nine.

"(Brohawn) had a tremendous year," Sanders said. "We didn't expect him to go 13-0, but we expected him to do well."

Sagmoen, drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 13th round, broke the school record for batting average. Sagmoen hit .454 to break Steve Stanicek's eleven-year record.

Sanders said Sagmoen's success wasn't unexpected.

"He was remarkable; he did a tremendous job, but it didn't surprise us," he said.

Sagmoen said the post-season honors won't make up for not getting a chance to go to the College World Series.

"I was happy to break the school record, but none of it makes up for not making it," he said. "A lot of guys in Omaha right now are All-Americans. I'd rather hit .250 and be in the series."

Sagmoen said he hoped to continue his success into the major leagues.

"I think I can give them consistent everyday play and good solid defense," he said. "I plan to do what I did here at Nebraska."

 jump at 25 feet 9 1/2 inches to give him an All-American honor.

Senior Kevin Coleman capped his collegiate career at UNL with a sixth place finish in the shot put at 61 feet 11 inches, which earned him his second-straight All-America honor. Junior Andy Meyer threw 56 feet 10 1/4 inches to place him 15th in the shot put. Meyer's 195 feet 8 inches throw in the discus placed fourth and earned him an All-American honor.

Freshman Riley Washington finished 10th in the 100-meter dash at 10.43 seconds.

On the women's side, junior Kwani Stewart earned an All-American honor with a seventh-place finish in the 100-meter hurdles at 13.38 seconds. Freshman Paulette Mitchell was ninth in the shot put with a throw of 50 feet 3 1/2 inches. Junior Shanelle Porter, the defending 400-meter indoor champ, walked away with a fourth-place finish in the competition with a time of 52.12 seconds.

Freshman Nicola Martial finished 13th in the triple jump at 39 feet 10 3/4
