Missouri defensive coaches trying to turn things around

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — As much as Bob Stull has been under fire for his average of three victories a season at Missouri, it's the defensive coordinators who've seemingly taken the fall.

Skip Hall, the Tigers' fourth defensive coordinator in four seasons, hopes to close the revolving door. He said he's not worried that he's the fourth in line, or that Missouri, 3-8 last year, was dead last in the Big Eight in total defense the last two seasons.

He just wants to be judged on his merits.

"What happened last year and the year before is ancient history to me," Hall said. "What happens today, tomorrow and the next day, that's very important to me."

"I hope we can bring in some stability and some confidence and a good aggressive package that these players

will be able to grab onto, and I've tried to instill a belief that we can win."

One thing already in place is good chemistry with the head coach. Hall and Stull go back to 1971, when Hall was a graduate assistant and Stull an assistant coach at Kent State. Both were assistants under Don James at Washington.

"I wouldn't sugarcoat it or anything, but I think there's been a good healthy respect and a good friendship between us," Hall said.

Hall's style of coaching also appears to be a good fit. Like his predecessor, Don Lindsey, who left to become defensive coordinator at Southern California, he will use an attacking style of play.

"That's been a real easy adjustment," Stull said. "He's real easy to work with, and his style is similar to what we used last year. Actually, it's easier to play."

The players agree. Senior defensive end Rick Lyle, one of eight returning starters, said this has been the best of his four transitions.

"It's hard to get into a groove when they change defenses every year," Lyle said. "But it's been smoother this year than in the past."

Lindsey had a lot of success in his single season, shaving 134 points off the season total allowed and 104 yards per game off the 1991 numbers. Hall said the big difference between him and Lindsey is he'll take more chances.

"We're becoming even more aggressive," Hall said. "Last year, they kind of laid the foundation, and this year we're going to push the pedal to the metal, so to speak."

For the first time in his five years at
