

"Offensively we executed a lot better, and at this period of time things have gone about as well as we expect-ed," Osborne said.

The offense set the tone for the day on the first drive, marching 83 yards on 11 plays

Calvin Jones carried most of the load on the drive, rushing five times for 54 yards and a touchdown.

It was Jones's only action on Saturday because he sat out the rest of the scrimmage to protect his bruised heel

from further injury.

Byron Bennett missed a 52-yard field goal attempt to end the Huskers' second drive. But the offense rebounded on the next drive and went 65 yards on eight plays capped by a six-yard touchdown run by Damon Benning.

Frazier engineered the most impressive drive of the day on his final

The drive began with Frazier completing an eight-yard pass to Johnson. After a five-yard run by Benning, Frazier connected with Trumane Bell twice, first for 10 yards and then for 41 yards. That set up a nine-yard toss to Eric Alford for the touchdown.

scrimmage without any major injuries. Back-up I-back Damon Benning sustained a shoulder injury but it is not expected to keep him out of action.

Before the injury, Benning rushed for 27 yards on five carries. First-string I-back Calvin Jones had 54

yards rushing on five carries. Freshman Lawrence Phillips led all rushers with 63 yards on seven

carries. Clinton Childs rushed for 62 yards on just two carries including a 45-yard touchdown run. Osborne said he felt secure with the Husker quarterbacks' running,

even though they were protected from contact Saturday.
"We just didn't feel like we could

afford to get one of them hurt because we are thin at that spot right now," Osborne said.

## University Health Center / GM-Southwest Student Insurance

Again this year UNL and GM-Southwest are working together to provide a health care program to help off-set the high cost of medical care. Your University Health Center is working with the Student Insurance carrier to offer such a plan. This program is open to both graduate and under-graduate students.

There are some changes this year in the procedure for enrollment that will be affecting International Students.

Immigration laws state that International Students must be financially responsible to reside in this country. The UNL policy requires mandatory insurance for International Students. These students will be required to show proof of private insurance or will be billed automatically on their tuition statement for Student Insurance.

As in the past, all students will be required to seek initial treatment at the University Health Center whenever possible. To effectively utilize this policy, your Health Center fees must be paid as well as your insurance premi-

Dependent coverage is also available for an additional premium. The student must be on the Student Insurance program in order for dependents to be enrolled. Applications for the dependents of International Students, as well as for all Domestic Students and their dependents, are available at the University Health Center Business Office. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS DESIRING BASIC STUDENT ONLY COVERAGE DO NOT NEED TO FILL OUT APPLICATIONS!
