leaving ink behind. The skin heals over the punctures, and the tattoo becomes permanent.

The needles cause some pain, and physical discomfort is another factor prospective customers should consider.

"It hurt," Ewoldt said. "It wasn't excruciating, though. After awhile, it gets to where it's kind of a numbing feeling. It's just an annoying pain.'

Cost is another consideration. The price varies with each size and design requested, Ley said.

Large artwork, such as scenic work or large animals, starts at approximately \$50. Roses, hearts, fraternity letters and other smaller designs average about \$30.




