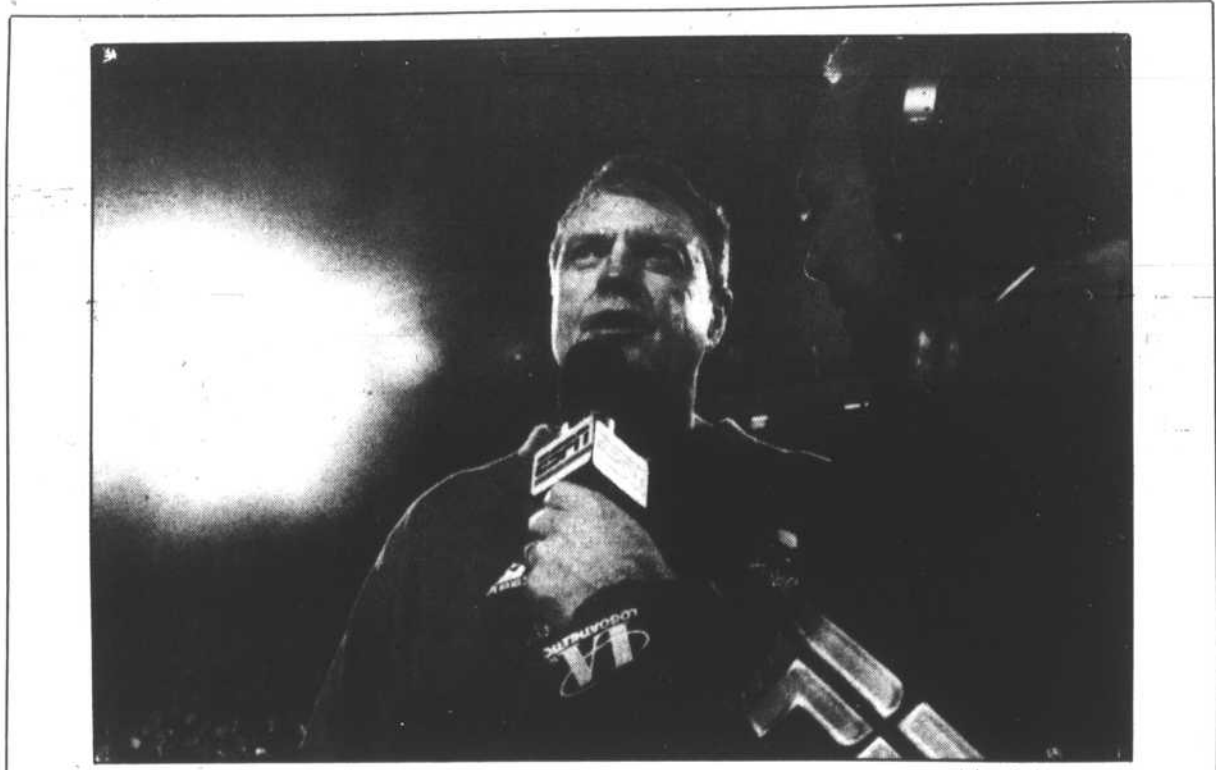

Cornhusker coach Kerry McDermott said his team played an "average tournament."
The tournament included players from Drake, Creighton, Wichita State, Southern Illinois-Carbondale and Iowa State.
At No. 5 singles, Jay Segrist, the only senior on the team, took first

place. The doubles team of Henrik Andersson and Adrian Maizey won the No. 3 doubles title.
Geoff Lance finished second in No. 2 singles. Frederieck Riesbeck finished second in No. 3 singles. And Dino Teppara finished second in No. 6 singles for the Huskers.
In No. 2 doubles, Segrist and partner Christopher Nielsen finished second.
"We had a lot of guys reach the finals but I think we were a little too satisfied with getting there," McDermott said.
