

Emotion carries orchestra's show



Concert review

The Warsaw Philharmonic Orchestra took to the Lied Center stage Friday night with a flourish of energy and emotion.

Conductor Kazimierz Kord, who has served as musical director for the Polish orchestra since 1977, led the ensemble through a vigorous exploration of emotions.

The first selection was from Andrzej Panufnik, a Polish com-

poser whose personal life was filled with strife and hardship. Those experiences were recounted vividly Friday in his Symphony No. 10. A disturbing piece replete with unhappy undertones, the symphony was punctuated by drum reverberations that were particularly chilling.

While it was obvious the piece was meant to symbolize the disharmony Panufnik felt with his homeland, understanding this still did not make the piece enjoyable.

For the second selection, the Warsaw Philharmonic was joined on stage by Ruth Laredo, a renowned American concert pianist. Her performance of Sergey Rachmaninoff's Concerto for Pi-

ano No. 1 in F-sharp minor, Op. 1, was physically enthusiastic, and her collaboration with the orchestra on this lively piece seemed satisfactory to both.

The high point of the evening was the orchestra's interpretation of selections from Sergey Prokofiev's Romeo and Juliet, Suite No. 1 and 2, Op. 64.

Written for the Bolshoi Ballet in 1938, the music alternates between passionate romance and urgency, a variation Kord and company handles exceptionally well. The selections were beautiful and an appropriate conclusion to an emotional performance.
