

Jones runs over Kansas again, but credits Cornhusker defense

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Calv Jones must feel a little empty nov knowing that he'll never again get run wild on the turf of Kansas' M morial Stadium

Jones rushed 29 times for 195 ya in Nebraska's 21-20 win over Ka sas Saturday. The outing was his best since he totaled 294 yards as freshman against Kansas awren

"My effort was there but ... I have to give a lot of credit to my blockers,' Jones said. "Both the linemen blocked great and the receivers downfield. The fullbacks also did a great job."

Jones, who was held out of the majority of last week's practices with a flu virus, has also been hampered throughout the season with a knee injury he suffered in Nebraska's open-Cr.

"In the first half, I felt myself getting fatigued rather quickly," Jones said. "I felt a lot better in the second half but I did seem to get fatigued easily from the virus."

But with 10 minutes left in the game, Jones overcame the virus when he broke free for 51 yards to Kansas' 8 yard line. The run set up a Tommie Frazier-to-Trumane Bell touchdown that gave Nebraska a 21-14 advantage.

"That was an isolation play that got rolling behind a lot of great blocking," Jones said. "After that play, I
