"Children constantly ask me," Harroun said. "When am I going to be able to buy the 'Adventures of Caveman Mike?'"

"It's not a matter of if it will sell. It's already sold. 'Kid Tested and Mother Approved,'" Harroun said.

In the mean time Caveman Mike isn't idle.

He's made a few appearances in Omaha in the past couple of months, he said, and is negotiating with a local restaurant to do kid's birthdays in its party space at a percentage per head.

He said he also would like to get a band together.

"I want to call it Caveman Mike and the Dinosaur Rockers," he said. "But I put up ads for musicians, and I only got one response."

He said some musicians might think that playing children's shows had to be bland work.

But Harroun said he loves working with children.

"I've worked with kids for

years," he said.

"In 1987 myself and about a dozen engineers (from Ford Aerospace) got together and formed the World Council for Human Awareness.

The council, of which Harroun was president, published an international newsletter.

The council's publication was an attempt to increase awareness of verbal abuse in its hidden forms, he said.

It's a subject that seems to rest heavy on Harroun.

"To create mental images in a child's mind that they're failures goes deeper than any tone of voice," he said.

"When the message is one of failure but the voice is calm, it can be more damaging."

But these days Harroun is dreaming other dreams, trying to get his own act together.

"I don't see why Caveman Mike couldn't tour the world," he said. "Do shows in Japan."

And suddenly he's off dreaming big again.

"I mean if Ninja Turtles can do it — and they don't even have fingers to play their guitars..."

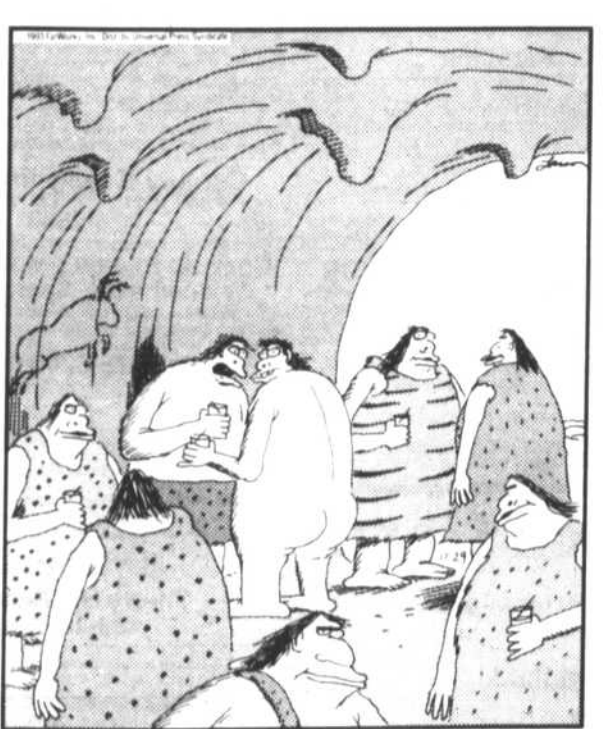
