



# Seniors lead team in turnaround

their record to 3-2. Following Nebraska's 91-82 loss to Appalachian State in Boone, N.C., Wednesday night, senior captains Jamar Johnson, Eric Piatkowski, Tom Best and Bruce Chubick decided it was time to "straighten things out" during a layover in the Louisville, Ky., airport.

The setback to the Mountaineers dropped the Cornhuskers' record to 1-Nebraska's worst start since the 10-18 season of 1989-1990.

"We, as the seniors, decided it was time to call a team meeting now," Johnson said. "So we had a layover in Louisville and did it there.

Piatkowski said the loss to Appalachian State, coupled with the Huskers 78-75 loss to Texas on Nov. 28, put a damper on the beginning of the season, but did not cause panic among

the players. "If we can go ahead and take everything one game at a time," he said, "then we can make up for all of this. But I'm not even thinking about us getting back where we should be until we win some more.

Virginia or Nebraska, is that I am the best football team in the country because nobody has proven otherwise," he said.

But that doesn't mean that Bowden, who hasn't won a national championship in his 28 years of coaching, wouldn't want at least half of the national title, from either the Associ-

ated Press or CNN/USA Today polls on Jan. 2.

"I would like to have any part of it I can get, so I can go to my grave without you saying that I never won one," Bowden said.
