Phi Gamma Delta sanctions

1. Phi Gamma Delta alumni will share the full report of its internal investigation of the events surrounding Knoll's accident.

2. Alumni of Phi Gamma Delta will develop a strict code of behavior for members, including absolute prohibition of alcoholic beverages in the chapter house and absolute prohibition of hazing

3. Every current member's past conduct and academic record will be reviewed to determine which members will be permitted to remain active and live in the house. Those selected must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

4. A university-employed resident assistant, paid for by Fiji, will live in the house through the 1995-96 academic year.

5. Each semester, fraternity pledges and members will be informed of past Code of Conduct infractions and action taken against the

6. Each semester, fraternity members must attend a meeting where the Student Code of Conduct and fraternity code of behavior will be reviewed.

7. The fraternity will not be allowed to pledge any new members until the summer of 1994.

8. All fraternity sneaks must follow the code of conduct. Active members cannot be involved with sneaks.

9. The fraternity will be on conduct probation through the 1997-98 academic year. Any major infractions will be grounds for charter

10. The fraternity will not be permitted to hold social events where alcohol is served through the 1996-97 academic year 11. Through 1994-95, the fraternity can participate in Greek intramural

sports, but is not eligible to win awards 12. The fraternity will develop a comprehensive proposal for an on-

going community service program. Each member will contribute a minimum of 12-16 hours per month.

13. Each active member and pledge must complete an alcohol education program at their own expense

A new chapter adviser must be selected.

15. Public disclosure will be made of all charges, the fraternity's

admission or failure to dispute violations and the sanctions given.

1989, the group was punished after a member raped a woman inside the house

Griesen said about 20 individual members involved in the Knoll incident would go before the studentfaculty judicial board early next se-

Spanier said he supported the sanctions, which combined punishment with education.

"We are, first and foremost, an educational institution," he said, "and thus our approach to violations of our disciplinary code has historically been educational.

Griesen said he favored the board's decision, which would rebuild the chapter with a core group of members uted to this report.

The decision recognizes that the fraternity is not "rotten to the core." "I don't want to damn everybody

because of one incident," he said. Walt Stephenson, president of Fiji's house corporation board, agreed it would have been unfair to suspend the chapter and punish young members who had nothing to do with the inci-

Instead, Griesen said, the sanctions could rebuild Fiji into a model fraternity

With the alumni watching over the house, Stephenson said, goals of rebuilding the chapter would be suc-
