Smith prepares for future here

NU President-elect Dennis Smith continued his four-day Lincoln visit Tuesday, meeting with members of the Nebraska Legislature and various NU administra-

tors. The main goals of this week's visit — Smith's third to Nebraska - are to get familiar with the Office of the President and meet with senior University of Nebraska ad-ministrators and staff members.




