



For the Husker women, who started off the year 7-0 but are now 9-5, the Ohio State meet will serve as a stepping stone for the Big Eight Championships in Lincoln on March 26.

The Nebraska women have been on the road for their last two meets, and the Huskers went 2-5 in those meets. Coach Dan Kendig said the team was looking forward to performing in front of a home crowd again.

"The home crowd has a lot to do with us doing good," Kendig said. "You get to sleep in your own bed the night before. Just being at home will be a big plus for us. We know what to expect, and we're comfortable here."

He said the 14th-ranked Huskers needed a solid performance against the Buckeyes.
