Schlafly, on the other hand, has been called a "pioneer of American Conservatism." She is a graduate of Harvard and Washington Universi-

Schlafly played an important role in the defeat of the Equal Rights Amendment. She also served as a member of the Commission on the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution under President Reagan.
