

Altman to inherit Creighton program

coach Dana Altman became the new men's basketball coach at Creighton University on Thursday. He becomes the 14th head coach in Creighton's

Altman declined to discuss his salary, but he said it was a five-year contract that can be renewed after

each year he was at Creighton. Altman replaces Rick Johnson, who resigned March 2 after three seasons with the Bluejays. Johnson had a 24-59 record with the Missouri Valley Conference team over that

Altman said he wasn't unhappy at Kansas State and that the toughest decision was leaving the players.

"Those 14 players I worked with all year, they're a great group of guys,' Altman said. "Four of them are seniors and they wouldn't be around me much anymore now that they're done with their eligibility, but those 10 underclassmen, they worked their tails off. They're a great group of young

Creighton's basketball tradition is solid, but the program will need to be

improved, Altman said. Before Thursday's announcement,
