Women gymnasts take fourth at regional, will miss nationals

The Nebraska women's gymnastics team finished fourth at the NCAA Midwest Regionals at Tempe, Ariz., on Saturday.



Hawkinson was second at 192.825 and Arizona State finished third with a score of 191.875. Coach Dan Kendig said his team

was capable of making the NCAA Championships.

"I have no excuses," Kendig said. "A lot of ways we're disappointed, but the team we put on the floor could have made it."

A bright spot for the Huskers was Jennifer Hawkinson, who qualified as the sixth seed in the all-around for the NCAA Championships.

Hawkinson finished second in the all-around by scoring 38.725. She scored a team-high 9.825 on the vault, a 9.575 on the uneven bars, a 9.575 on the floor exercise and a 9.750 on the balance beam.

"We just fell a little bit short," Kendig said. "We kept fighting back. We went in fourth and came out fourth, so things could be worse."

Huskers split with top teams

The Nebraska men's tennis team split a weekend series with the top two teams in the region.

The 6-13 Cornhuskers lost to Kansas, the No. 1 team in the region, 7-0 Sunday after beating No. 2 Wichita State 4-3 Saturday.

No. 5 singles player Brad Bernthal, a transfer from Kansas, gave the Jayhawks their only scare, losing 9-7 in the third set tiebreaker.

On Saturday, Bernthal, Omar Acevedo and Adrian Maizey all won their matches, and Nebraska took the

doubles point in beating the Shockers.

Acevedo, the Huskers' No. 3 singles player, beat Wichita State's Jason Grubb 6-2, 6-3. Bernthal won 6-4, 6-2 over the Shockers' Sandor Jongert. In No. 6 singles, Maizey beat Richard Lamothe 6-4, 6-1.

The Cornhuskers took the doubles point by winning two of the three matches. Maizey and Andy Davis beat Grubb and Simon Cornish 8-6. Bernthal and Fredrik Riesbeck defeated Phil Cooper and Lamothe 8-6.

Nebraska travels to Columbia, Mo., to play Missouri today.

The Huskers did not make an error in the three-game series and allowed only eight runs despite walking 20 Golden Eagle hitters in the series.

The strong defensive play has given the Huskers more confidence when they take the field, Sanders said.

"The difference between the way we are playing now and the way we played during our slump," Sanders said, "is that now we come to the ballpark thinking we are going to

win." Jed Dalton, who had six hits in the series, including a 4-for-4 performance on Saturday, said Nebraska's performance in other aspects of the game were catching up to its defense.

"I think we are playing really well as a team right now," Dalton said. "We still aren't executing as well as we could, but we are improving in all areas."

The Huskers pounded out 12 hits in an 8-3 win on Saturday. Matt McKay provided the biggest blow with a two-run homer. Dalton also drove in four runs.
