

ing," Osborne said. Sims, who will be a sophomore in the fall, was one bright spot for the Husker offense. The No. 3 Iback, who was injured last spring and missed the 1993 season, ran for 82 yards on 12 carries and scored one touchdown Saturday.

"I can't wait to get back out there," Sims said. "It's been a year and a half, and I'm ready to go. It doesn't matter what I do; I just want to contribute to the team.
