## NRoll registration system has encountered few bumps

Except for a few minor glitches, UNL's telephone registration system is rolling along smoothly, the director of records and registration said.

Earl Hawkey said registration officials only had a few changes planned for the system, and students had only minor complaints about the touch-tone registration system was installed last spring for class registration.

The only major change to NRoll is that students no longer can withdraw inadvertently

from all of their classes, he said.

Several students have unknowingly withdrawn by accidentally pressing 9 on their touchtone phone, Hawkey said. To avoid that, the system will verify that the student wants to withdraw before completing the action.

withdraw before completing the action. University of Nebraska-Lincoln officials will wait to make other changes until registration for fall classes is complete.

One small complaint about NRoll, Hawkey said, has been the amount of time it takes for the system to audibly list a student's classes.

Some faculty members and administrators were concerned that students would skip faculty advising sessions once NRoll was in place, he said. Some colleges, such as the College of Journalism and Mass Communications, require students to get faculty approval before registering for classes.

Linda Shipley, the associate dean of the college, said advisers hadn't had problems with students skipping advising sessions. Hawkey said he hadn't heard of that problem

Hawkey said he hadn't heard of that problem existing in other colleges on a large scale. Actually, he said, 2 percent more students in the Division of General Studies met with their faculty advisers for fall registration.


Hawkey said students still could drop and

add classes using NRoll. The procedure is outlined in the schedule of course offerings, he said.

Students who encounter a closed class should periodically check the status of the class, because it frequently changes.

The system has enabled students to register at their convenience, he said. It also has freed the registration and records department from organizing the elaborate drop/add setup at the union, he said.

And, Hawkey said, students can avoid the long registration lines of past years and use the extra time to enjoy themselves.
