Chambers to have running mate

The director of affirmative action at Southeast Community College has agreed to run with State Sen. Ernie Chambers as a write-in candidate for lieutenant governor.

Jose Soto, a 45-year-old Hispanic activist, said he would fill the second spot on Chambers' gubernatorial write-in bid. Chambers announced on Sept. 21 that he would enter the gubernatorial race as a death-penalty protest candidate.

Soto said he spoke with Chambers, who encouraged him to run as a

write-in for lieutenant governor. Soto said he opposed the death penalty and believed Chambers was a good minority leader.

"It is important that we acknowledge that there are many voices in the community we call Nebraska," Soto said. "It is important that people of color recognize leadership ... and support each other."

Attorney General Don Stenberg issued an opinion on Oct. 20 that said Chambers must choose a running mate for write-in votes to count. Chambers has said he would choose a running mate "under no circumstances."

Soto said his decision to run with Chambers was not influenced by the attorney general's opinion. He said he had discussed the opinion with Chambers and agreed that it was flawed.

"It (his candidacy) is a response to my belief that we must be willing to be active," Soto said.

Soto said many reasons led him to run, but his interest increased with the recent death of Francisco Renteria.

Renteria died on Oct. 1. after a scuffle with university and Lincoln police officers.

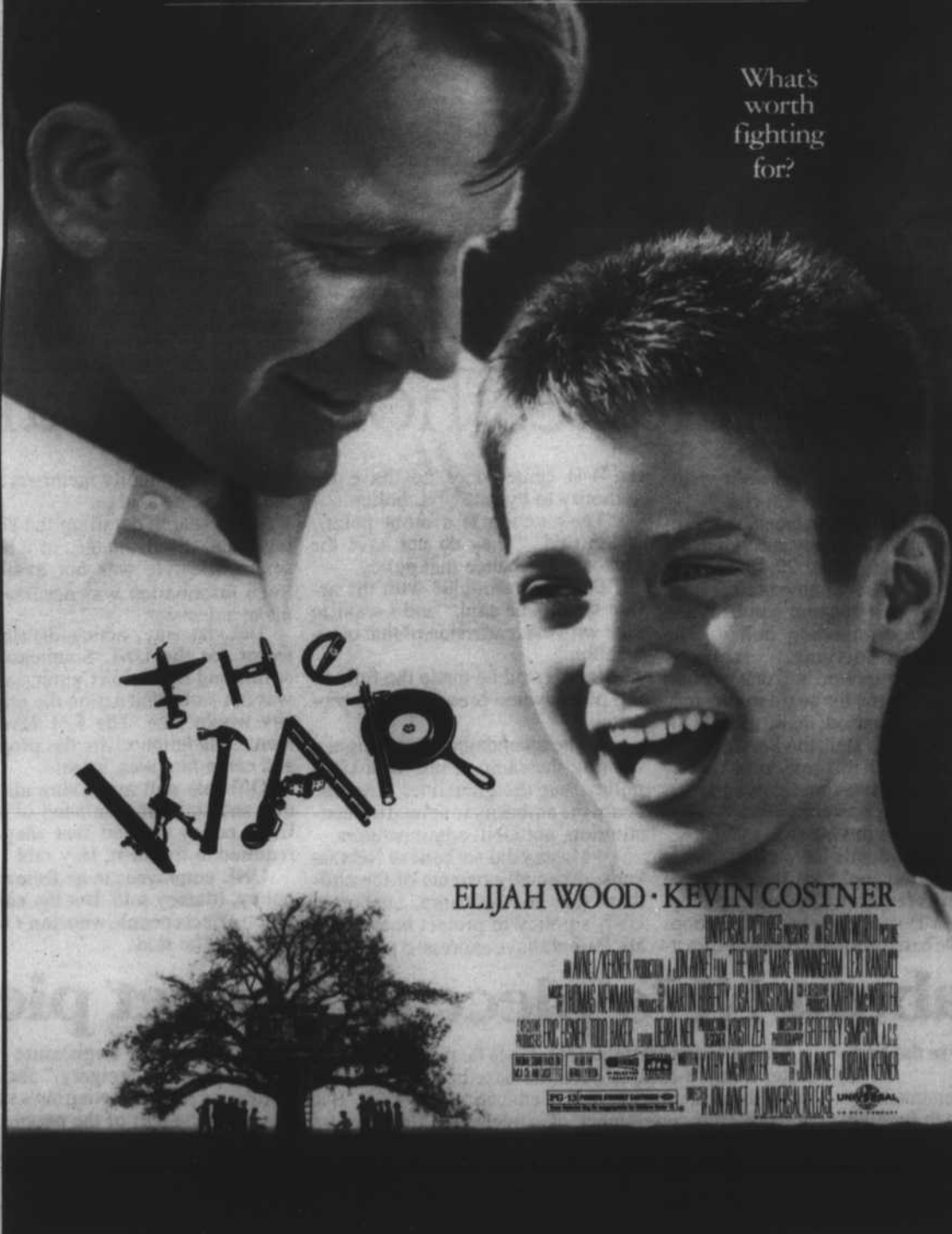
