Limpopo is the only band in the world to perform a Spanish medley of "La Bamba" and "Twist and Shout," dubbing it a "Spe-

cial Russian Folk Song."

The "Special Russian Folk Song" also is the only song on the album sung in English or Spanish. The rest are sung in Russian.

"You don't have to understand Russian," he said. "It's not really important what you play, but how you play," Bernov said.

Limpopo's playing translates into humorous songs that are punctuated by ankle bells, hot accordion licks, Cossack kicks and many exclamations of "Hey!"
