## Nolte's land 'down and out'

CHARLESTON, W. Va. (AP) — The property Nick Nolte and his ex-wife once planned to turn into a housing tract called Down and Out in South Hills failed to draw a single bid at a tax auction. The couple, who split up earlier this year, owed \$2,161 in taxes on the house and four-acre lot, which were valued at \$425,000. It was one of 3,000 properties put up for bid on Monday at a county tax sale. Before their divorce, the Noltes

had proposed turning the property into a 10-lot subdivision, but local planners rejected the idea after neighbors complained.

The neighbors were particularly offended by the proposed development's name, a takeoff on Nolte's 1986 movie "Down and Out in Beverly Hills."

With no one buying the property, the Noltes have 18 months to pay the back taxes.
