Buffaloes spoil the Husker party

Colorado's continuous second-half defense helped spur the No. 6 Buffaloes to a 73-55 win over the Nebraska women's basketball team.

The Cornhuskers, 10-8, 1-5 in the Big Eight, never led and trailed only 31-30 at halftime before a season-high 3,789 at the Bob Devaney Sports Center, Sunday.

But the 15-2 Buffaloes spoiled the party by scoring 42 second-half points en route to their tenth straight victory.

The Buffaloes were led by Isabelle Fijalkowski, who scored a game-high 19 points.

Nebraska coach Angela Beck said the Colorado defensive pressure was just too much for the Huskers.

"They played relentless defense," Beck said. "Physically we got pushed around a lot."

But the Huskers stuck with the

ranked Buffaloes early.

With 14:48 remaining in the game, Lis Brenden pulled Nebraska to within 39-38.

However, 15 seconds later, a 3-pointer by Colorado's Shelly Sheetz gave the Buffaloes a four-point lead.

Sheetz then hit another 3-pointer 38 seconds later to give Colorado a 45-38 lead.

After a jumper by Anna DeForge, who led the Huskers with 13 points, Nebraska only got within five points once for the rest of the game.

Beck said Sheetz made the difference in the game. "It kind of broke our back and our spirit," Beck said.

The Huskers, who picked up their first Big Eight win with a 75-63 win over Missouri, trailed Colorado by 11 with 6:49 left.

After baskets by Pyra Aarden and Kate Galligan, Nebraska trailed 57-50 with 5:03 remaining.

From that point on, the Buffaloes

outscored the Huskers 16-5, including a 14-0 run to help Colorado post its tenth straight victory.

Colorado coach Ceal Berry was happy to leave Lincoln with a win after last year's 63-61 win.

"The second half I thought we did a better job of protecting our lead," Berry said. "The first half we kind of got comfortable."

In the first half, Nebraska pulled to within 15-14 after a Galligan 3-pointer.

Then an 11-0 spurt by Colorado gave the Buffaloes a 26-14 advantage.

The Huskers used two DeForge 3-pointers to battle back to give the Buffaloes a slim one-point cushion at the half.

The Huskers trailed Colorado by one point eight times during the game.

"We only went six-deep as far as production," Beck said. "We really wore down, mentally and physically, by the end of the game."
