Lincolnites roll into Stone

Lincoln band Mercy Rule is no

longer just a band. Now it's much, much more. It's a "smart pop-punk trio."

This is the moniker given to vocalist/bassist Heidi Ore, guitarist/vocalist Jon Taylor and drummer Ron Albertson by Rolling Stone magazine.

'I guess it's better than being called a stupid pop-punk trio," Taylor said.

Mercy Rule was featured in the national music magazine's annual "New Faces" piece, a lineup of promising new bands selected by Rolling Stone writers.

"I know that Relativity (Mercy Rule's record label) has invited Rolling Stone writers to our shows whenever we've played New York in the past," Ore said. "I guess we must have caught someone's eye."

Ore said the article was a bit of a surprise to her and her bandmates. "We had very little to do with

it," she said. "The picture that went along with it was taken last sum-mer for another article."

Receiving attention from one of the nation's largest music periodicals is just one of the good things that happened to Mercy Rule in 1994, Ore said.

The band's second full-length album, "Providence," received overwhelmingly positive responses from critics. The band has also seen increasingly larger attendance figures at its shows.

"It's kind of hard to describe," Ore said. "I don't think we could have written better record reviews ourselves. People really seem to be getting our message, what we're trying to say."

The members of Mercy Rule have been occupying themselves lately with a number of weekend shows in Midwestern cities including Madison, Wis., Chicago and St. Louis, Ore said.

A more extensive tour of the West Coast is in the planning stages for March, she said.
