Booth to remind students about condoms, safe sex

Love, romance, candy and hearts are popular topics on Valentine's Day, but responsibility is the theme taught during National Condom Week.

National Condom Week began at the University of California at Berkeley in 1978, said Pat Tetreault, sexuality education coordinator at the University Health Center.

The American Social Health Association has been a sponsor of National Condom Day for more than a decade, President Peggy Clarke said.

"On the day people are thinking about love and romance, they also need to be thinking about loving responsibly," Clarke said.

ASHA has a national sexually transmitted disease hot line and brochures about sexuality issues. National Condom Day, however, has a special focus.

"National Condom Day is focused towards people in a romantic relationship or people thinking about getting into one," Clarke said.

The health center, along with Peers Encouraging Responsible Sexuality at the University of Nebraska, is spon-

soring a week of activities promoting condom education and use. The PERSUN program is run by the health center.

"Our philosophy is education with some humor," Tetreault said.

A booth will be set up in Nebraska Union Thursday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The booth will feature desktop computers with an informational quiz on condoms and STDs. There also will be a contest to guess the number of condoms in a fishbowl.

Condoms will be distributed at the booth this week. The health center also distributes condoms from a dish outside the pharmacy and sells them in the pharmacy.
