

Students to pay full price for Camelot

Tickets for this weekend's production of Camelot at the Lied Center for Performing Arts will not be available at half price to students.

A story in Thursday's Daily Nebraskan said the tickets, which are \$28, \$24 and \$20, would be available to students for half price.

The Lied Center is unable to offer these tickets at the discount prices because it is not part of its

series, said Eileen Brewster, Lied Center box office manager.

"This is a rental from another company and it is up to them," Brewster said.

Camelot is produced by Encore Enterprises, which set the ticket prices.

Most Lied Center events are offered at the discount because the center is reimbursed for the student tickets, she said.

Camelot will play tonight and Saturday night at 8.

As a Romanian priest said, the Romanians are forbidden to express themselves outward, and this fear is soon projected inward until the Romanian is emotionally flat and compressed.

Lucia (Ashley A. Hassler), a young Romanian girl with dreams of marriage and America, endangers her family. Her father, Bogdan (Jason Richards), and mother, Irina (Kathryn Burton Hollerman), fear for their family.

As a Securitate officer (Charles Russell) interrogates Bogdan, the relationship is filled with fear and uncertainty as Bogdan is afraid to utter a

word.

Romania's youth, however, are not so afraid. The heroes of their generation, Radu (Jonas Cohen) and Gabriel (Dean Houser) displayed an attitude of true revolutionary spirit, but are crushed when that spirit is robbed from them.

In a play so supported by a historical lattice-work, portrayal is very important. The interspersed Romanian phrases and translations kept the audience in the living room of a Romanian family.

The play continues tonight at 8. Additional performances are Saturday and Sunday at 8 p.m. and Feb. 21-25 at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$9 for the general public, \$7 for faculty, staff and senior citizens and \$6 for students.

Laurel Shoemaker, the set designer, deserves congratulations for his realistic, three-sided house set. The detail was fantastic, and the house's three doors and staircase provided for interesting action.
