KRNU music directors may not think of the other stations as competitors, but they do pay attention to them, Fairbairn said.

"Obviously, we're not going to play the same songs that another radio station will play to death," Fairbairn said.

What "other stations" do play is largely based on what people want to hear, primarily because commercial stations depend on advertising revenue to survive, KRNU Station Manager Rick Alloway said.

"We've had to do a little fine tuning with our programming," he said. "The addition of other stations like the Planet can make us work a little harder to find something that isn't heard of, or heard often. But that's not necessarily a bad thing."
