Malachi Thompson "New Standards' **Delmark Records** Grade: A-

On his third album, "New Standards," composer and trumpeter Malachi Thompson is joined once again by the Freebop Band. Their, high level of talent enhances their tremendous leader.

"Joshua" starts off right away by highlighting Thompson. This up-beat favorite focuses all of the energy present and creates a great prelude to the second song, "Pinnoccio".

The album's most clever song is a funky arrangement of "The Wizard of Oz" song "If I Only Had a Brain." If you're not careful, you might find yourself whistling it, with or without the hefty horns.

The album's finale is a four-part suite called "Chicago Sound-scapes." This song traces Thompson's hometown, from his first orchestra to three personally memorable spots in the city.

'New Standards" will be one of the top ten jazz albums of the year. Get with the hard bop and pick it up.



There will be activities such as a welcome party and visitations in around the area to the jail, courthouse, and other interesting places. Leave at 5:00pm on March 17. Cost is \$18 per person.
