The Lincoln Chamber Orchestra will perform a "Basically Baroque" concert tonight at the Lied Center for Performing Arts.

Director Yong-yan Hu will lead the orchestra, said Carolyn Rometo, the orchestra's general manager.

The orchestra will perform Handel's "Water Music," Mozart's "Eine Kleine Nachtmusik" and

Bach's Violin Concerto in E major.

"Water Music" will include three suites Handel composed for English summer festivities. The piece was first played in 1717 by an orchestra on a barge in the Thames River.

The orchestra will feature Sonya Monosoff as a guest violinist in the Bach Violin Concerto. Monosoff is a professor of music and director of the chamber program at Cornell

University.

A pre-concert talk will be held in the Lied Center's Steinhart Room at 7:05 p.m. The concert will begin at 8 p.m.
