Smith also addressed re-engineering teaching in the classroom. He said he did not support increasing faculty productivity because that meant faculty members would have to teach more classes.

'Instead, we have to increase the learning environment," he said.

Lecturing is not productive and is an old way to teach, but that is how most classes at NU are taught, he "There are other ways to interact with students," he said.


