But students will face a \$10 increase in towing fees, from \$25 to \$35, and an additional

Swanson said not increasing permit fees was in part the fulfillment of a commitment made to students last year when fees were raised.

Last year's increase was part of a bond issue approved by the Board of Regents to pay for parking improve-






