


## Page 13 Torn knee ligament ends season for Nebraska soccer co-captain

Nebraska's women soccer coach John Walker felt ill after the Cornhuskers' 5-0 exhibition victory over Queen's University at the Abbott

Soccer Park Complex Thursday. Walker said he was pleased with the Huskers victory, but was sickened by the loss of Tanya Franck.

Franck, a junior co-captain on this year's team, tore her anterior cruciate ligament 20 minutes into the first half, team physician Dr. Robert Dugas said

Dugas said Franck would miss the entire season.

"It just leaves a sickening feeling in my stomach," Walker said. "It's an unbelievable loss; an unbelievably sickening loss for the team and no doubt for her. It has taken a little bit of the glamour off the victory.'

Walker was able to find glamour in both the Huskers offense and defense against Queen's.

The Huskers had 30 shots on goal and 41 total shots against the Queen's and limited them to only one shot and no shots on goal.

The Huskers will try to use some of that determination in an exhibition game with Vanderbilt Sunday at noon.


