Pacific coach expects to compete, not wi

Pacific football coach Chuck Shelton is not worried about winning this weekend.

Asking his players to defeat the No. 2 team in the nation, Shelton said, would be unrealis-

"They absolutely are committed to playing," he said. "We hold them re-sponsible for being ready to play. It's a challenge. And certainly I think the kids will accept the chal-

lenge.
"If I hold them accountable for beating Nebraska, then we may not see good results. But if I hold them

well as they can, this can be a good game for us."

Pacific, 1-2, is coming into Lincoln off a 56-24 loss to Fresno State, a game in which the

Tigers were not prepared to play.

"Fresno State is a good team," Shelton said. They are probably a better team than Pacific. But we were self-destructive. We didn't play a good football game, and we beat ourselves in many ways.

One week before the Tigers' poor showing against Fresno State, Pacific defeated Oregon State 23-10, the school's first win over a Pac-

10 opponent in more than 12 years.
"It was a huge win," Shelton said, "huge because it was local. We played almost mistake-free football and beat a Pac-10 team. That makes it big right there, because we are a Big West team.

Shelton, who coached Utah State from 1986responsible for being prepared and playing as 91, has brought four teams to Lincoln in the

last decade. Including last year's Pacific squad that lost to the Cornhuskers 70-21, his teams have been defeated by an average score of 62-

Despite the Tigers' apparent lack of com-petitiveness, Shelton said he wouldn't pull the Nebraska game from the Pacific schedule if he

were presented with the opportunity.

"We are playing as class a program as there is in the U.S.," Shelton said. "In my opinion, they are the best program in the nation. Their program and the atmosphere there is something that you wouldn't be able to duplicate anywhere, and I'd like my players to be a part

Shelton said he had watched film of Nebraska's three offensive outbursts this season, drawing the conclusion that no defense could completely shut down the Husker attack. Nebraska has averaged 63 points and more than 650 yards a game in three wins.

"They are awesome," he said. "I think they have taken college offense to another level. They do what they do so well that there is no answer for it."

After last week's 77-28 win over Arizona State, Nebraska coach Tom Osborne was accused of running up the score by Sun Devil coach Bruce Snyder. Shelton said that issue had become the "topic of the year." But the Pacific coach said he wasn't worried about Osborne exploiting Pacific.

"My stance on it is this: I cannot dictate to a coach what he needs to do," Shelton said, "I think there are some situations where coaches have intentionally run up the score. But in games against Tom Osborne, I certainly don't think that has been the case.

"In fact, they may have hurt themselves just trying not to do that. I don't think Nebraska got a whole lot out of that game against us last


