Offensive woes keep Tiger team off scoreboard

After getting shut out 30-0 last week at Kansas State, Missouri coach Larry Smith vowed he would revamp the Tigers' offense.

Well, against Nebraska Saturday, that so-called revamped offense didn't work. For the first time since 1966, Missouri suffered back-to-back shut-outs in Nebraska's 57-0 victory at Memorial Stadium.

Smith said he didn't change the offense a lot; in fact he said he tried to simplify it more.

"Right now it's a bit frustrating," Smith said. "It's the second game in a row where we didn't score any points, and you just have to say, 'Why?'"

Missouri had nine first downs, only

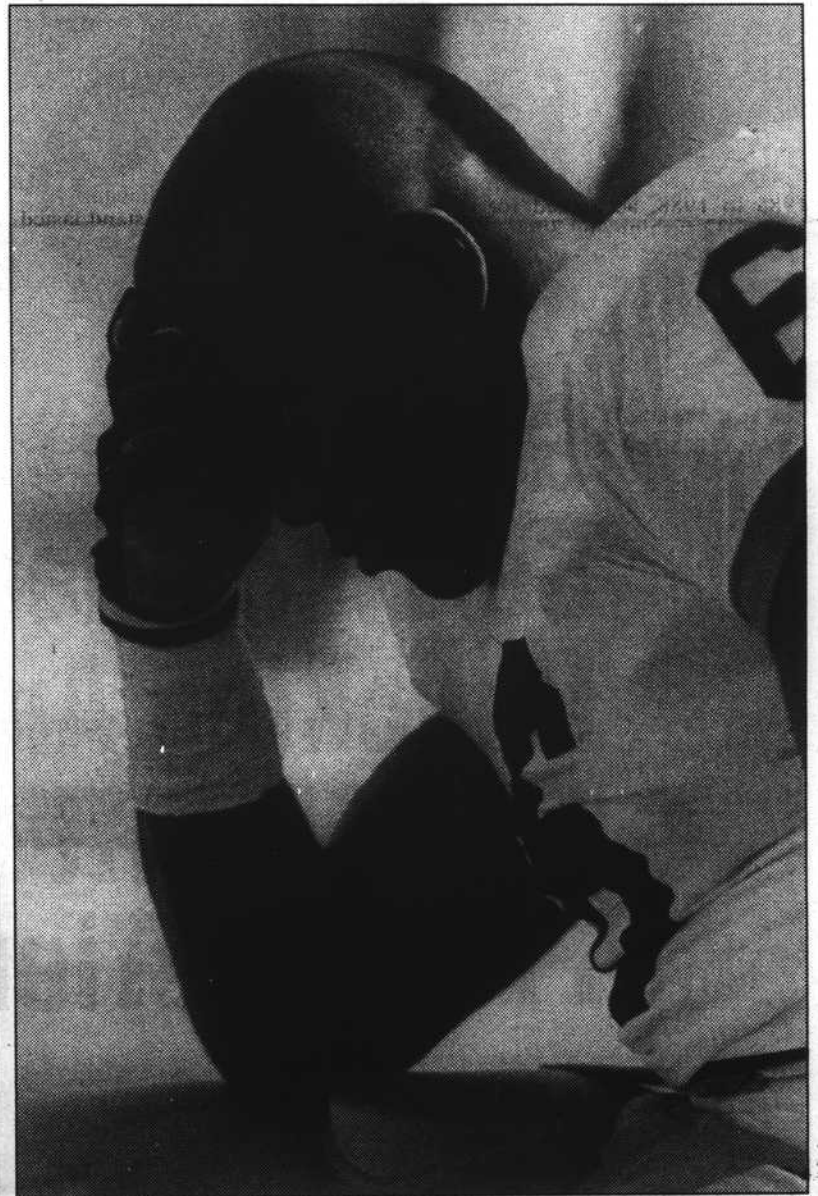
