

Golf team nets fifth in tourney

The Nebraska men's golf team's score of 305 in the final round of the Red Raider Intercollegiate Tournament earned the Cornhuskers a fifth-place finish Tuesday at Lubbock, Texas.

Nebraska finished with a three-day total of 898, 20 strokes behind champion New Mexico State. The Huskers dropped 12 strokes in the tournament's final day.

Freshman Steve Friesen, who finished in 15th place after a final-round score of 77 to finish at 223, was Nebraska's highest finisher.
