Wildcats come back after NU with win over top 10 Kansas

After Nebraska routed Kansas State 49-25 on Oct. 21, the Wildcats weren't sure which direction their season would go, with rated opponents Kansas, Oklahoma and Colorado remaining on their schedule.

Kansas State answered all those questions Saturday with a 41-7 thrashing of undefeated and sixth-ranked Kansas.

Wildcat coach Bill Snyder said he wasn't afraid that the loss to Nebraska would ruin the remainder of Kansas State's season.

"I don't think afraid is the term to use," Snyder said. "Every week you just prepare the very best you can, for whatever team you play. I think it's always a concern, though. You never know how you'll bounce back."

Snyder said after Kansas State's loss to Nebraska, the Wildcats were too emotionally charged for the contest.

He said it took the Wildcats awhile to get over the loss.

"I think in the early stages of the week, we were suffering from a hang-over effect," Snyder said. "In regards to that, the loss was a great disappointment. We put a lot into the game. It was a great investment. I guess the greater the investment, the greater the loss. But it gradually went away some during the week, and we were ready to

play." Kansas State had not beaten a top 10 opponent since 1970, and it was the Wildcats' biggest margin of victory over Kansas since 1955, when Kansas State beat the Jayhawks 46-0.

Snyder said he wanted to treat the victory as a win over a good team, and nothing more.

"Is it a big win? Certainly," he said. "Is it the biggest win we've ever had here? I don't know if you can say that. We'll just treat it as a big win. Certainly, it's a step up."

Kansas coach Glen Mason now faces the same situation that Kansas State faced a week ago — bouncing back from a big loss in a big game.

"One game should not affect the balance that much," Mason said.

The Nebraska soccer team dropped its final regular season game to UCLA in overtime Monday.

The Cornhuskers dropped a 1-0 decision to the No. 21 Bruins in their only overtime game of the year, rebounding from a 4-0 loss to Southern California on Friday.

UCLA's Miriam Parsa scored her first goal of the season at the 106:51 mark to give UCLA the win.

Husker coach John Walker said Parsa's shot had a funny spin on it and was able to find its way into the

coach at West Bend East, said Jahnke told her she wanted to continue her volleyball career at Nebraska because of the environment.

"It was the best fit for her," LaPorte said. "She liked the players, she liked the program and she just felt very comfortable with the surroundings."

Jahnke narrowed her choices to three schools — UCLA, Notre Dame and Nebraska — and chose to become a Husker after returning from a trip to UCLA on Oct. 17, LaPorte said. Jahnke also visited Florida and Wisconsin.

"She came back from Nebraska feeling good about herself," LaPorte said. "Then she would go on another trip, and there would be some hesitation in her voice."

In the end, there was no hesitation in picking Nebraska, LaPorte said.

This season, with the pressure of recruiting and an ankle injury, Jahnke has been frustrated at times, LaPorte said.

After coming within two points of a state title last season, LaPorte decided to change the philosophy of her team. That has led to fewer opportunities for Jahnke this season. Also, the travel on all the recruiting trips has had a draining effect on her.

"I think she has handled the situation well," LaPorte said. "It's hard to play as smoothly as normal with all the outside things going on."

Last season, Jahnke led West Bend East to a runner-up finish at the state tournament. In the five-match state tournament, Jahnke knocked down 103 kills. Overall, she averaged 7.2 kills a game last season.

"Katie's very much aware, and she was very sure of the things she wanted," LaPorte said. "These were all programs that were within the realms of what she wanted, and she picked the one that fit."

showing my displeasure with the call.' He said, 'You're out of here,' and I said, 'You need to go back to school and learn how to swallow that referee's whistle right.'

"It didn't really matter, though. It was already in the bank and closed up. I should have hit the damn guy. That way I would have something to look forward to tomorrow."

The 10-year NBA veteran said he was happy about coming to Chicago. Rodman started his career in Detroit and played the last two seasons for the

San Antonio Spurs.

Last season Rodman became only the third player in NBA history to win four consecutive rebounding titles, even though he missed the Spurs' first 15 games because of suspension and 14 games in April and March because of an injury.

Rodman said although he had no displeasure with the San Antonio fans, he was happy to get away from the Spurs players and management.

"I went to Chicago to get the hell away from San Antonio," Rodman said. "Back there you had guys who wanted to go home and wanted to be breast-fed by their wives. Here you get guys that will hold their nuts up

there and by God get ready to rock 'n' roll."

Rodman said he was surprised by the fans' reaction to his ejection Friday night. After Rodman left the court, the 14,335 fans in attendance started chanting, "We want Rodman."

Their reaction didn't change his feelings toward Nebraska.


