Beatle mania 'Fab Four' anthology to hit Lincoln stores today

Music stores and radio stations all over Lincoln are ready for the release of the "Beatles Anthology I" album

Best Buy, 400 N. 48 St., is offering a free combination of two exclusive Beatles items, a photo book and an interview compact disc, with every \$22.99 CD sold.

Best Buy began selling the compact disc early this morning during a special store opening from midnight to 1 a.m.

Homer's said the CD would be priced at \$19.99. The Homer's location on 61st and O streets planned to begin selling the CD this morning at 6 a.m., accompanied by a live broadcast from the Eagle station's morning ra-

dio program, "Joe and Timmo." At Camelot Music in Gateway Mall, \$26.96 CDs can be reserved for \$5. With that reservation, a 10 percent discount card will be given out, good on all Beatles merchandise until December 1996.

the new Beatles album went on sale last night, the vinyl version won't be available until early December.

And even then, said Stuart Kolnick, owner of Recycled Sounds, the vinyl edition probably won't be very easy to come by.

"If a store orders a 1,000 copies of the vinyl album set, they may get 50," Kolnick said. "And if they order less than a 1,000, they may be in trouble."

Kolnick said Recycled Sounds will be celebrating the new release by displaying rare Beatles albums and unique Although the compact disc set of Beatles film footage for customers.

Just like the Eagle, other radio stations are joining the Beatles nostalgia

Paul Powers, DJ for KFRX, 102.7-FM, said listeners have been calling his station often, asking about the new Beatles' song "Free as a Bird."

"People have been calling in, asking for more details," he said. "They wish they had released more tracks with the new song. It's a pretty special

Nick Wiltgen, a sophomore broadcasting major working at KFRX, said on what format radio stations should play the new song was a small emerging controversy.

A radio trade magazine, the Top 40 Airplay Monitor, recently published an article questioning whether the new Beatles song belonged on radio stations aimed at younger audiences, Wiltgen said.

The song, which will likely be a hit, would be the first Beatles song in the top 40 since the movie "Ferris Bueller's Day Off" featured the song "Twist and Shout," Powers said.

Emotional fans laud 'great song'

The first airing of the new Beatles song "Free As a Bird" touched off a second round of Beatlemania — this time minus the screaming fans. The new alburn arrived at stores Monday under extraordinarily tight security.

Radio stations, even all-news stations, aired the new song incessantly and many music stores across the country stayed open past midnight this morning to start selling the album on its official release date today.

"A lot of Beatles fans have called to say how emotional it is to listen to it," said Andre Gardner, program director at New York City's WXRK-FM, which played the song every hour. "Even if they're not Beatles fans, they're calling to say it's a great song.

"I walked in the door this morning and had three calls before I could put my purse down. The phone hasn't stopped ringing since then," said Karen Aamodt, clerk at the Music Disc store in Denver. "Free As a Bird" was first broadcast Sunday night during ABC-TV's airing of a documen-

tary on the band, which split up in 1970. On the basis of overnight ratings, ABC estimated 47 million people watched the show. The Beatles' first appearance on the "Ed Sullivan Show" in 1964 drew 73 million viewers.

The midtempo ballad was originally recorded on a home cassette player in 1977 by the late John Lennon, Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr added their voices, instruments and new lyrics.

With Harrison's slide guitar and production by Jeff Lynne, its sound owes as much to the Traveling Wilburys as the Beatles. The composition is reminiscent of Lennon's 1970 solo song "Love," and Harrison's Beatles elegy, "All Those Years Ago."
