





"Toy Story, The Original Soundtrack" **Randy** Newman Walt Disney Records Grade: A

Randy Newman, best known for his slightly comedic touch in songs such as the '70s hit "Short People,' takes a crack at Disney's latest film with "Toy Story."

And he succeeds, creating a lush, warm underscore that perfectly captures the feelings of the film.

The highlights of the soundtrack are "You've Got A Friend in Me," "Strange Things" and "I Will Go Sailing No More." These songs are delightful, featuring Newman's gravelly voice and his wonderful melodies and splendid lyrics.

"Made in Heaven" Queen **Hollywood Records** Grade: B+

1991: Freddie Mercury dies of AIDS.

1995: Queen releases a new CD, "Made in Heaven."

Recorded when Mercury was going through the final and most painful stages of the disease, "Made in Heaven" represents Freddie Mercury's final words. Mercury, arguably one of rock's most flamboyant performers, refused to let his personal pain turn "Made in Heaven" into a dreary CD.


Opening with sounds of chirping birds and winding through ballads beaming with joy and appre-ciation for life, "Made in Heaven" gives an almost childish view of the end.

Put together in the four years since Mercury's death, "Made in Heaven" has no shortage of the classic Queen sound — intricate guitar riffs and gorgeous harmonies with Mercury's voice soaring over everything.

From the very first eye-popping track, "It's a Beautiful Day," to the unlisted jaw-dropping finale, "Made in Heaven" represents the very best of what made Queen so good. This last track, a 22-minute spectacle of twinkles presents what may be the very first rock depiction of the afterlife. And if you listen to Mercury, heaven isn't a bad place to be. Filled with songs about the sanctity of life and the wonder of growing up, "Made in Heaven" is a tremendous album. Unfortunately, it's probably Queen's last, unless there are more unreleased tracks no one knows about.

"Made in Heaven" represents the last words of one of rock's greatest performers before his death. Even though Freddie Mercury may not be with us anymore, his legacy lives on in his music.
