Both of these painful reoccurrences are supposed to be wild family fun.

Instead, watching employees being abused by both their superiors and the hotel's customers for more than an hour proves to be excruciating for anyone with a smidgen of a social conscience.

In one of the more "tasteful" scenes, Alexander promises his children a vacation at a different hotel, so his family could "nag" new hotel employees and "make their lives miserable," too. Yippee.

Alexander's generosity peaks in a scene where Dunaway orders an employee to be removed for bumping into her. Instead of firing the maid, Alexander offers the bluecollar worker a week's paid vacation in exchange for pretending to






