

'Kinesthetic Energy' featured at Sheldon

A collection of color lithographs and miniature sculptures entitled "Kinesthetic Energy" by Mark Di Suvero is now on display at the Sheldon Memorial Art Gallery.

Di Suvero, whose art is being featured in the temporary exhibitions gallery, is easily recognized on campus for his red I-beam sculpture "Old Glory," which was presented as part of the Sheldon's sculpture garden collection in 1987.

Manipulation of scale is Di Suvero's paramount ability as an artist. His reputation in the international world of sculpture attests to this, as does his adaptation of the lithograph medium for repro-

ducing sculptural visions.

His lithographs both portray exploded constructions in a 2-dimensional space, and invoke images of urban expansion in a graffiti scrawl of paint. As a native of New York, the artist uses the industrial landscape, which maintains a predictable role in his work.

Through the various red, orange, and blue color schemes, Di Suvero manages to combine images of mechanical abstraction with the vibrant energy found in Keith Haring's two-tones.

The dull steel sculptures, interspersed in the gallery space, are easily overwhelmed by the brilliance of the lithographs. Their inclusion is almost construed as a distraction.

"Kinesthetic Energy" will be on display through April 7. Admission is free.

head with divine poise, she might symbolize Nebraska's own proud acceptance of its enormous agricultural responsibility.

Negmat-Zoda paints with an intriguing sense of magic realism, drawing on a middle-class hodgepodge of biblical, new-age and mythological elements.

"The Battle" in particular, is a startlingly ugly apocalyptic scene with a hazy Old Testament flavor. In it, a blonde angel grapples in a shoving match with a long-haired Middle-Eastern man outside a city.

The sheer ugliness of the terrain in this painting is captivating. The grimy golden ground, the hideous green and yellow sky and other decaying land-

marks all suggest a gross world that is about to blow up any minute — and the sooner the better.

About "The Battle," Negmat-Zoda commented only, "It's a battle between negative and positive, you know, between nice and bad."

of an EBN performance really important. The video is organically integrated into our work," said Greg Deocampo, a member of EBN.

Within the compact disc are interactive liner notes, including a video wall that the user can change at will.

"The video wall was my idea," Deocampo said, "back from when I was building video walls for raves in 1992. So the ability for a user-driven one seemed logical."

Even big-name bands like the Cranberries have hopped on the bandwagon with their project, "Doors and Windows."

"The product follows the band from their early days to the concert at Woodstock," said Mika El-Baz, a public relations agent for Island Records.

El-Baz said "Doors and Windows" was selling well.

Still, not all sales of Enhanced CD/CD Extra titles have been excellent, distributors say.

Part of the problem is that some

companies charge higher prices for their Enhanced CDs/CD Extras, said Mark Waldrep, president of AIX Entertainment.

"Some companies jack up their prices. When we released 'Rhythm of the Pridelands' for Disney, there were two flavors, one with the video on it that was sold at software stores, and one without it, which was sold at music stores. They were the same price," he said. "Other companies tack on a few dollars."

Jimmy Dixon, director of New Media for Reprise, agreed.

"Our Enhanced CDs will probably cost the exact same or just a little more. We see it as a value-add rather than something entirely separate."

Reprise's first Enhanced CD release, from Mike Oldfield, will be Macintosh only. But later projects are planned to be compatible for both Macintosh and PCs.

Sony Records, however, sees things differently. Dual releases have been made for albums from Toad the Wet Sprocket, Alice In Chains, Bob Dylan and more. Sony's CD Extras tend to run between \$5 to \$10 higher than the regular release.

"We have a whole department, and the money does have to come from somewhere," said Xandra Ess, director of new development at Sony.

In addition to the amount of time spent on the project, each CD Extra comes with an extra CD, containing Corel Drivers to aid in the usage of the CD Extra.

Other Enhanced CDs that have higher price tags include Soundgarden's "Superunknown," Sarah McLachlan's "The Freedom Sessions," as well as releases from Bush and Moby.

Dixon said she thought that full-length releases were not the only place where the Enhanced CD had merit.

"With singles, there is a ton of space left over, and companies spend a great deal of time on videos that are never seen more than once, so why not import that video onto the empty space on the CD?" Dixon said.

Ess agreed. "We may have free multimedia, just a taste like a video, on CD5s, as a little extra bonus."

The industry is behind the Enhanced CD format, and it is here to stay.
