Chancellor James Moeser will meet with ASUN for the first time tonight,

and a bill dealing with him will be presented.

Hurtgen said she and other ASUN senators were pleased with how the Athletic Department had strived to work with ASUN on the student seating issue.

"Our reaction has been positive so far," Hurtgen said. "We appreciate that they (the Athletic Department) are including us within the decision."

Hurtgen said she hoped Moeser would give input on the bill.

Rev. "Donut hole" Michael McGregor, a pastor at the First United


Methodist Church and a student in UNL's Ph.D. program for social personality psychology, will be presid-
