OMAHA (AP) - An Omaha police officer who was shot in the shoul- "I heard a big boom and dead might have been wounded by another officer, police said Wednesday.

Officer Michael Diehm, 37, was in good condition Wednesday after surgery. The bullet traveled down his arm and exited through his elbow.

He was wearing a bulletproof vest when he was shot, police spokesman Sgt. William Muldoon said.

The man who was the target of the "no-knock" warrants, Donald Hurley, 43, died in an exchange of bullets Tuesday at about 10:50 p.m. He was wanted for felony assault and for being a con-vieted false in 1092 for the loss of the loss for the los victed felon in possession of a firearm.

The warrants were the result of an investigation of a felony assault that had occurred March 15. At the time, a 21-year-old man had reported that Hurley had held a gun to his head, pistol-whipped him with a handgun and then threatened to kill him if he told anybody.

Muldoon said when officers entered the front door of the north Omaha home, they yelled "Police!" repeat-edly. The door opened to a small entryway, and Hurley was in a living room on a sofa with a gun.

"He had the handgun, and he aimed it at them and started firing," Muldoon said.

Muldoon did not know how many shots were fired at police.




