

New band perks up Lincoln, Legislature

Zoo Bar, 136 N. 14th St., will have a "Twisted Twang!" tonight as it houses the release party for The Perks' first compact disc, "Twisted Twang!"

"We haven't played recently because we were working hard on the album," said Judi Letheby, the band's vocalist.

The Perks were formed when Judi and her husband Bob, who is the bassist, moved to Lincoln from Norfolk.

"We put an ad in the paper and Butch (Berman, the band's guitarist and keyboardist) called us up," she said. "We held auditions for drummers, and we chose Dean (Bridges).

"Everything just clicked." The Perks have played at the

Zoo Bar before, as well as the Howard Street Tavern in Omaha, among other places.

Letheby described The Perks' sound as "rockabilly and blues, though we have a surf song called 'Bobby Dean' on the recording."

The Perks also have built up "kind of a fan club at the Legislature," where Letheby works.

"Three of the songs are about people I work with there," she said.

When asked if she had any songs about problem people at the Legislature, she replied, "'Slick Little Louie' is about someone who used to work there. The song tells it all."

"Twisted Twang!" is being released on Sty Records, The Perks' self-run record label.

"I'm doing all of the public relations myself. It's a lot of work," Letheby said.

The Perks will play tonight at the Zoo Bar from 5 to 7. There is a \$4 cover charge. They also will play at Eldorado Hills in Norfolk on April 6 from 8 p.m. to midnight.

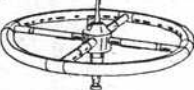

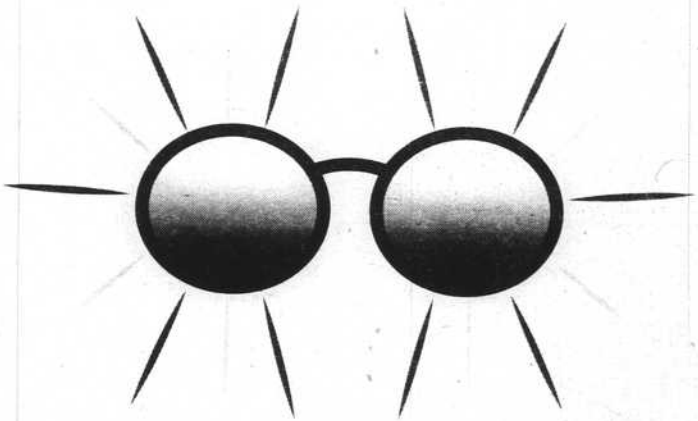
