Rumor has it that, during filming, Brando walked up to Kilmer and said "Don't confuse the size of your paycheck with talent." Ouch!


Next week, the critically-acclaimed "Trainspotting" finally pulls into Lincoln. "Trainspotting" follows a group of youths as they make decisions about their lives.
