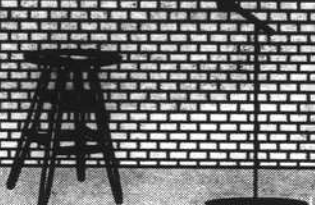

## NU football team elects its captains

Jared Tomich, Mike Minter, Chris Dishman and Damon Benning have been elected by the Nebraska football team as its captains for the 1996 season.

In their NU careers, these four seniors have demonstrated leadership qualities and their teammates believe they possess the experience to guide Nebraska in its quest for a third straight national title.

Tomich, a first-team All-America rush end, places his election as a captain above all his other awards and accomplishments.

"This is a lot bigger," he said. "Those are great. They're wonderful, but just to have that respect is great. This is directly from the team."

Minter, a rover, seeks to lead by example.

Each of the captains have matured throughout the years, Benning said.

performance with 61 assists. Sophomore Jaime Krondak led the team defensively with 28 digs and was one short of her career best with 20 kills.

Megan Korver ended the match with her 10th kill of the night. Amy Steel and Helen Hjorth recorded 18 kills a piece for BYU, which fell to 0-1 on the season.

The Huskers moved on to face the host New Mexico Saturday night. Despite a hostile crowd, Nebraska swept a defensively sound Lobo team 17-15, 15-9, 15-12 in what Pettit called the "best match of the year."

Nebraska exploited its height advantage throughout the match. The 6-4 Reitsma towered over the much

smaller New Mexico front line.

Reitsma set a new Nebraska record for kills in a three-game match with 28 and was named most valuable player of the tournament.

Reitsma was unaware of the record until the team returned to Lincoln Sunday.

"Coach basically told Fiona to go to me and it worked," she said. "If other teams start keying in on me, it is going to open up opportunities for the rest of the team."

Krondak, who effectively used a diagonal strike for 12 kills Saturday, joined Reitsma on the all-tournament team.

Nepo also had a good match with 54 set assists.

"Fiona really set the ball consistently well," Pettit said. "She made good decisions, and she served tough. I was real pleased to see that. If she doesn't do that, we don't win."

Friday and Saturday night, the No. 4 Huskers will play Michigan State at the NU Coliseum. The fifth-ranked Spartans, who lost to Nebraska in a national semifinal match last season, return five starters from last year's 34-3 team.

"It will be interesting to see if we can continue to improve against an exceptional opponent," Pettit said. "BYU and New Mexico are good NCAA volleyball teams. Michigan State can win the NCAA championship."
