Mexican government unearths likely clues to killing conspiracy

hair and a mud-covered human skull discovered at a ranch belonging to a former president's brother may strengthen the case against him in one of Mexico's most notorious political killings.

Mexican prosecutors suspect that the remains, unearthed Wednesday, are those of a man who conspired with Raul Salinas de Gortari to kill a political rival.

Raul Salinas is the elder brother of former President Carlos Salinas. Scion of a powerful political clan, Carlos Salinas left Mexico in disgrace soon after his term ended in December 1994; he was blamed for corruption and the collapse of the country's economy.

Raul Salinas has been jailed case as a homicide.

MEXICO CITY (AP)-Bones, since February 1995 on charges of plotting the murder of a top ruling party official, Jose Francisco Ruiz Massieu.

But prosecutors say Wednesday's discovery could represent powerful new evidence in the case against Raul Salinas if forensic tests identify the remains as those of Salinas' alleged conspirator, Manuel Munoz Rocha.


