

## UNO engineering building approved

Wemhoff said the only building he knew of that operated mostly on private money was the Lied Center for Performing Arts, which has an endowment for maintenance

The commission approved a budget recommendation, which will be submitted Tuesday to the governor and the Nebraska Legislature's Appropriations Committee. The commission must submit a report every two years.

Also in the construction budget report was the approval of the building of the Information Science, Technology and Engineering building at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, a project that will cost at least \$37.5 million.

The engineering building was the only capital construction project for which the University of Nebraska requested money, and the


only project to receive priority status from the commission.

The commission must approve new facilities before state money can be used for construction.

Funding for the engineering building will include \$23.5 million in state funds and \$14 million in private funds over the next two years, the commission's report shows. The state already has set aside \$500,000 for the project.

Construction of the new building should be completed in 1999.
