

Illegal immigrants denied entry

INS, U.S. Attorney's office plan for transport, will not prosecute

GRAND ISLAND (AP) — Twenty-one illegal immigrants who were stopped on Interstate 80 last week will be sent back to their respective countries, immigration officials said.

Three of the immigrants were from Guatemala; the other 18 immigrants were from Mexico.

Jerry Heinauer, district director of

the Immigration and Naturalization Service in Omaha, said Saturday none of the individuals would be held for prosecution.

The U.S. Attorney's office in Omaha declined to prosecute the individuals because they did not have criminal records and had not made previous attempts to enter the country il-

legally, he said.

INS is arranging to use a military aircraft service from El Paso, Texas, to transport the immigrants home Monday or Tuesday, Heinauer said.

The immigrants, ranging in age from 17 to the 30s, were stopped about five miles east of the Grand Island interchange by the Nebraska State Patrol.

Officials give no explanation for resigning

AUBURN (AP) — The principal and guidance counselor at Auburn High School have resigned without any explanation.

Principal Jerry Beach resigned last Monday, while guidance counselor Craig Fredin quit on Tuesday. Both resignations have been accepted by the school board and will take effect at the end of June.

The Nemaha County Herald has reported that the resignations might stem from controversial material in the school's yearbook.

Fredin supervised the student publication, which was released in September. The school offered to refund money to yearbook buyers who were unhappy with its content, including a picture that depicted Leonardo da Vinci's Last Supper with faces of staff members superimposed on Jesus and the disciples.

Beach had final authority on the yearbook's content.

Superintendent Myron Ballain said the school board made an agreement not to talk about the resignations. Ballain said he could not speak either.

Beach was hired in 1989 and Fredin in 1991.
