
The new feature uses the same system used for NRoll, Hawkey said, so the university didn't have to pay anyone for new software or installation contracts.


Here's how the new system works: Professors fill out bubble sheets to record student numbers and final


· The sheets are turned over to the Registration and Records office, where they are scanned by a machine into a computer, which processes the results.

· The scanner creates a file, which automatically transfers into the voice recording, similar to NRoll.
