CD Review

"Pre-Millennium Tension" **Island Records**

Most of us suspect that 2000 will be like any other year. And even though predictions of Armageddon abound, the fire-and-brimstone rantings of street corner fanatics are easily dismissed by most rational people, for the most part.

But a larger-than-normal hunk of that doomsday junk has stuck to Bristol trip-hop aficionado Tricky, and "Pre-Millennium Tension" is the re-

This album, Tricky's second, is a slight but significant departure from "Maxinquaye," his 1995 debut. "Maxinquaye" was an angry and dark collection of songs, but it was sliced into often radio-friendly, sometimes hummable 4- or 5-minute tunes.

"Pre-Millennium Tension" takes a less accessible, but artistically improved approach, relying on drawnout samples and swirling textures of

drum, guitar, bass and synth sounds. Songs like "Christiansands" and "Bad Dream" are typical of the whole album, relying on repetition and a slow build of emotion that never resolves to result in a beautifully claustrophobic electronic symphony.

The opening track, "Vent," pulls lyrics from Grandmaster Flash's "The Message" in a masterful manner; when Tricky half-whispers, "Don't push me, 'cause I'm close to the edge,' you have no choice but to believe him.

This is the sound of the walls closing in, and if this is what Tricky believes the next century will sound like, we'd better hope he's wrong.
