


'Anaconda' keeps spot at box office

LOS ANGELES (AP) - "Anaconda" kept its grip on the top boxoffice spot for a second weekend with an estimated \$12.2 million in ticket sales.

"Liar Liar" was second with \$10.2 million, according to industry estimates Sunday. The Jim Carrey comedy has earned \$133.6 million in just five weeks.

"Anaconda," about giant snakes that terrorize scientists in the Amazon, saw its take drop just 27 percent from its opening weekend, which by Hollywood standards means it had staying power.

Three new films made the Top 10, according to Exhibitor Relations Co. Inc.

"Murder at 1600," starring Wesley Snipes as a Washington homicide detective digging into a White House murder, opened in third place with \$8 million. "McHale's Navy," based on the old TV sitcom, tied for seventh place, grossing \$2.1 million. And Joe Pesci's new film about a professional killer and a luggage mixup, "8 Heads in a Duffel Bag," was ninth with a \$1.8 million gross.

Another hit-man comedy, "Grosse Pointe Blank," placed fifth, taking in \$4.9 million in its second week.
